- NH No answer, head of household or spouse not home, or home not accessible the house is currently occupied, but the resident is not home. Also, the home is not accessible due to a locked gate, vicious dog, etc., (you only revisit lots marked "NH")

Addendum for Central Texas Counties for "vacant lots" Code VT: as before but use a dash - US; AS; UH

US: unfinished structure—a structure was started, but never finished (e.g., missing windows/doors, no roof, etc.)

AS: abandoned structure—a completed structure is present, but it is clearly abandoned (i.e., the owner is not planning to return). Windows may be broken, graffiti may be present, roof caved in, no furniture, etc.

UH: unoccupied home—this is a completed home that is not occupied (grass overgrown, sand/dirt piled around the door, windows covered with fabric), but not abandoned (still has furniture, home décor). This is a highly nuanced code. What we're looking for here are migrant workers who are out of town for months at a time, but plan to return to the home. Use your best judgment.
