Introduction

A: I wanted to ask you – when they were giving out the titles to the solares, [TAXES] my father had a solar which was confused. He had it changed—and he was up to date paying his taxes. So my father sold that solar to me for \$4,000 dollars. I bought it from him. So I am going to begin from the day I bought it, from that point on paying my taxes and his and that's the way it's going to stay. What's past is past.

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- 7 [TAXES] Q: He paid his taxes?
- 8 A: Yes, yes but the solares were confused so it's like he was paying yours and not mine.
- 9 Do you understand?
- 10 Q: Ahuh.
- 11 [TITLE] A: So now I am in this process of seeing if they will the send the title in my name.
- Q: Once you receive the title ... How did it work before? In reality there are many legal problems...
- 15 A: Exactly.
- Q:That must be solved case by case. And I am sure that CRG has to work with every
- case, the title holder and the tax office county tax to resolve the problem. In reality
- there are an enormous number of cases, like your case there are hundreds. So you are not
- the only one. [TAXES] And I think that a step forward is that you are going to pay the taxes of your solar. So how do you resolve the previous issue? He has been paying...
- A: He has been paying all the time...
- Q: So I don't think there is a problem in this case.
- [CONFLICT] A: He was paying but it was the number (registry number?). He was
- confused because he had been given the number that way and that's how he was paying.
- But he knew it was not his but that of the neighbor on the next block.
- Q: And the neighbor was not paying?
- A: The neighbor was not paying.
- O: (Laugh) Well there are a lot problems. So we want to discuss as a group, particular
- cases will be resolved one by one by the CRG. We are here to get any idea of how you
- have understood, if you have really benefited from the title creation program. Okay? So
- 31 I'm going to ask the first question, and we are going to mainly focus on whether we are
- better or worse now that we have the a property title. [WAITING] And my first question
- is, do you feel more financially secure, economically speaking, now that you have your
- property title or is it that same as before?
- A: Excuse me, I don't have it yet. I'm still waiting.
- O: Still? And since when are your waiting?
- 37 [TITLE] A: Oh, I only got this letter. I am waiting, and they tell me that there is hope but
- I don't know. I have nothing against (does not say to whom), on the contrary, I am
- waiting for the problem with my title to be resolved and that's it.

- 1 Q: And are you living on this property?
- 2 A: No, it's a lot that I bought but it has not been resolved. Because as you say, there is a
- long process going years back, and some have been resolved. But unfortunately the
- 4 people for whom this has been resolved have not arrived yet. Perhaps they will arrive
- 5 later.
- 6 [WAITING] Q: Do all of the people who are here already have the property titles?
- A: No, not yet.
- 8 A: No
- 9 A: She has it.
- 10 Q: You do have it?
- 11 [TITLE] A: I have a title for one but not for the other.
- 12 Q: So you have two processes. [cannot hear too well]
- Q: Araceli, is yours already resolved?
- A: Mine from the beginning was correct and I got it at the courts. But since that I bought
- my father's, that's why I wanted to know if it's going to be resolved the whole issue of
- them being confused?
- Q: That has to resolve itself. It cannot ... [TAXES] What is done in this title creation
- program, these problems cannot [continue to] exist -- of people paying taxes for a piece
- of land that does not correspond to them. And that's really a problem. There are people
- who have been paying taxes but the land is not theirs. That's a problem.
- 21 [TITLE] Q: Norma, do you have your title? Through this program?
- 22 A: Yes
- Q: And Idolina, also?
- A: I moved here in 1989 and we had receipts and more receipts. I presented to Aidee
- Amado Vergara (?) all the receipts and they gave me the title. I have it now. I have had it
- 26 now for 2 years.
- [WAITING] Q: So here in this group there are two people who do not have it, Maria
- 28 and ..
- A: I don't. Well this time that they came all they gave me was a receipt but said that later
- they were going to send it.
- 31 Q: Like a paper?
- 32 A: Yes like a paper and they gave me a copy of the receipt.
- Q: When did this happen?
- A: Well I don't know how long ago. This last time they came.
- 35 Q: But recently?
- A: Yes not long ago.
- 37 A: Around two months ago.
- 38 [TITLE] Q: The big question we have, does having the property title mean a lot?
- 39 A: yes
- 40 A: Yes, of course.
- 41 Q: What does it mean?
- 42 [LOAN] A: It means you can resolve your expenses, in my case, through the bank. And
- for example my house is valued at \$84,000 dollars. So I took 30, like I can take out 40
- and that allows me purchases in the future, or in buying and selling.
- Q: Then, if one did not have the property title, one cannot ask for a loan?

- 1 [LOAN] A: It's not valid. You cannot ask for one. And right now that's what makes you
- of value the house. Savings are very poor and so if you aspire to another solar or a
- 3 truck, to buy in order to survive -- because here in the state of Texas, work is very hard.
- 4 So there is nothing left than cross ("Atravesar") the house in order to get money and then
- 5 you are going to live off that money.
- 6 Q: "Atravesar la casa" means to mortgage the house?
- 7 [TITLE] A: Mortgage, and without a title they would not accept the house. Do you
- 8 understand?
- 9 Q: Ahh, has anyone else done this?
- 10 [TITLE] A: Well I have not done it because I have not had the need. But I have heard that
- in past times, even if one had the title, being wherever you were from, it was not valid.
- Even if you had a title, if you went to the bank, it was not valid.
- O: But title to what? To the lot, the land?
- 14 A: Property, the land with the house. There were people who did have their titles, and
- they tried to get them in the bank, and they were worthless. Because it was property of
- those people and now they are of value (working).
- 17 [GET AHEAD] A: Not me, I have a very responsible husband and I do it to get ahead...
- 18 Q: You do what?
- A: Get money out. It's at 6% interest rate. Extremely low, so why am I going to buy a
- truck which is at 10% or 12% when I could buy it through the bank. I buy some solares....
- lots of people don't understand that it's not about need... no it's about getting ahead.
- How can I help my husband. That's where we can get ahead. [LOAN] So they give you
- 23 the money, your mortgage not because you're dying of hunger because here they give
- you food stamps and Medicaid but if you want to struggle to get ahead, that's how you
- can make money work. How can you get money? Sometimes through your property,
- that they are sure that you have good credit and that you are not going to lose it. And
- 27 that's what makes you make the effort to get ahead.
- [TITLE] Q: And you can do that now with a title?
- 29 A: Exactly.
- Q: Without a title, it cannot be done?
- 31 A: No.
- 32 [CONFLICT] A: It could not be done, not even before the problems were resolved -
- whether it was property belonging to Don Elias or the other man, and other details
- because I tried to do something similar and was unable to. Being one of those people, we
- were not able to...
- Q: What do you mean by "one of those people"?
- A: That they have a bad record, or not know too much, or have lots of houses. Because
- from what I know, they owed on lots of houses...
- 39 [LOAN] Q: But I have a question, because what you are saying is that they were not
- accepting the loan because of not having the property title, because it belonged to Sr.
- Elias or because the person that ...
- 42 [TITLE] A: Even if you obtained the title, the titles were not legal. There were two
- people who had the title to the same property. And they know that exactly. So even with
- 44 titles, there were two titles to just one property.
- Q: Like what happened with your father?

- 1 A: Yes like what is occurring with my father. But lets hope in God that this will be
- 2 resolved. I have taken this over. My father is 83 years old and used it as a parking lot.
- 3 [GET AHEAD] But that's what I do buying and selling in order to get ahead a little bit.
- 4 [TAXES] So my father no longer needed it, he could not continue with the taxes. So he
- 5 says, daughter who gives you or your brother. I will buy it from you to put it in the
- 6 bank for \$4000 dollars and it's valued at \$4900 here. Or for \$3900 which is what the
- 7 solares are valued at, the land. So I bought it. I just had to get to date with last years
- 8 taxes, from two years back to see where we are at -- If I'm going to pay the taxes of that
- 9 solar or am I going to pay the back taxes. That's what I want to clean up.
- 10 [TAXES] Q: A question about the taxes, starting from this program more people have
- obtained their property titles correctly, in legal order. Have taxes increased? Are they
- the same? Do you think there has been a change in the taxes because of this or not?
- A: Well, no, I ... no I have not seen that they have gone up. If they have increased it's just
- because of the economic state where in general they increase.
- 15 Q: Every year...
- A: Every year they increase. They are never going to lower taxes. (Laugh) They are
- 17 never going to decrease.
- Q: Is that the same that you have all experienced? Maria de Jesus, what about you?
- A: An increase comes, if you don't pay you have a balance and then there's interest.
- 20 And before that didn't exist.
- Q: This did not exist before?
- A: No. As far as I could remember no. That is if you owed \$1000 dollars, four years
- could carry it over and it was still \$4000 dollars. Now that's not so.
- A: They put more pressure on you to pay.
- A: Yes because my brother now owed for a solar in another colonia and it comes out to
- be \$5000 dollars that he owes, which he is late on.
- O: You mean accumulated?
- A: Accumulated. So now, it was at \$5000. They told me at the school it goes up \$60
- dollars a month. And what he owes is \$5000 dollars.
- 30 [TITLE] Q: Wow, do you have any idea of when this happened? Does it have to do with
- 31 the economic situation of the country or is it because now you have property titles so
- demands can be made?
- A: I don't know but he had the property title since 1990, I think he purchased there.
- And he paid for 4 or 5 years and then could no longer pay. And now it's going up.
- A: And why did he not sell it?
- O: Is it a very large piece of land?
- A: No, what's up is that the house is 50 by 50 with garages and all made out of block.
- A: That's why.
- 39 Q: (cannot hear- phone call comes in)
- 40 A: But he's already paying interests on the \$5000 dollars.
- A: [TAXES] I pay 400 and some, 470 for the house in taxes. But that's because the
- house is a bit big. And it has 2 stories. Mine too, and I pay 600 and some. I use up all
- the lot. And it's all cement -- A thousand and some feet.
- Q: And is it the same rate throughout the colonia or not?

- 1 A: Where my brother is at, it is a colonia that use to belong to Blas Chapa and Elias Tello
- 2 (?), something like that. But here I don't pay much. And my house is small, it's not big.
- [TAXES] But it's 50 by 50, and just the taxes for the school \$60 dollars. Because he 3
- 4 asked if I could pay for a month, and I said yes. And I said if I give you 50 how much of
- 5 it will go as down payment. Nothing, because you'll only be paying interest. But I am
- telling my brother to pay up, to find work. But ... 6
- 7 A: [TAXES] But why does he not sell it? Find a buyer and just say, look pay the taxes 8
 - and I'll sell it for so much. Let's say it's \$20,000 dollars. Give me 15 and with the rest
- pay the taxes. Otherwise, the whole time he's not getting anything out of it. That's what 9
- 10 my father did in a lot in Mexico.
- 11 A: How much? [TAXES] If he has all that backlogged, how long will they give you on
- 12 the taxes?
- 13 Q: Well that I personally do not know. I don't know the tax rules here. How much time
- 14 back, how much in interests? It's really not something I know about. But I think you can
- go to the offices, because if you don't go, you'll never find out. You need to know. 15
- A: [TAXES] They will even lower them. Yes, they lowered my taxes. With some 16
- letters that they send you, you personally go to the office and fill it out and next year they 17
- 18 will lower it 40 or 50.
- 19 O: Why?
- 20 A: Because of the facts they have of money coming in. Do you understand me?
- 21 Q: Really?
- A: At least to me 22
- 23 Q: You can ask for it? A decrease? It's good to know that.
- 24 A: But you have to go...
- [CONFLICT] A: Look, it's like they are pressuring you, they don't know what your 25
- 26 situation is, if your sick or you have no responsibility. So they put pressure on you to see
- if you'll pay sooner. But I would recommend to your brother to not lose it, to not let it go 27
- by the wayside. Like with my father's solar. If you can no longer do it, well here I am 28
- 29 who can. And right now I am setting up my son – he's 18 years old - with a solar and
- house. Because I say, son, if I can't then I pass it to you. Because the moment is going 30
- to come when my husband is not able to work, or I cannot resolve things. But there is 31
- someone to back me up. So counsel your brother to not lose it. On the contrary, get 32
- some benefit from it. If \$15,000 dollars fit him well, that's much better. 33
- 34 A: No, that house is now worth more like 50.
- 35 A: Well with even more reason. If it's worth 50
- 36 A: And is it in use?
- 37 A: In the colonia Benito Garza (?), behind.
- Q: I have another question about the taxes. Now that the majority have, and lets suppose 38
- 39 we all have the property titles of our homes, our houses – [IMPROVEMENTS] Is there a
- difference in terms of the improvements made on the house? Before, without the title, 40
- 41 did you say, I better not do anything because it's not mine, [TAKEN AWAY]
- 42 [CONFLICT or it can be taken away. Or is there really no difference?
- 43 A: I did not feel like they were going to take it away because I would not have let them
- have it so easily (laugh). And I did make lots of improvements on it. 44
- 45 [TAKEN AWAY] Q: And what about you Sra. Maria Jesus?

- 1 A: I was not going to take it lying down.
- 2 Q: You weren't going to take it?
- 3 A: Well, no how would you let it happen.
- 4 [TITLE] A: No. What was going on is that we have seen that they might give you the
- 5 title or not give it to you. There was something in this property title program where they
- 6 didn't allow you to solve it. (Cannot understand). Perhaps if we would have had
- 7 someone to back us up, then we could not have lost, right? But if you are willing to risk,
- 8 yes. Keep up the house and the solar even if there was no title. It was not a determining
- 9 factor
- 10 [TAKEN AWAY] Q: That's what we want to know. If the property title had any
- 11 meaning or not?
- A: Yes it had meaning. [CONFLICT That they were not going to knock the house down
- 13 (laugh). Because those solares there could not be bought, because they were too far away,
- on a ridge and I don't know what. As long as they pay me what I put into the house, then
- they can knock the house down.
- 16 (Lots of laughs and voices)
- 17 [LOANS] A: I wanted the money that I put into the house. Otherwise I was going to
- 18 lose
- A: It's a benefit no matter which way you look at it. For example I have since the 13th,
- or 24th put in central air conditioning. I put in central air downstairs because it's a two
- story house with the stairs on the outside. In my mind, I have always been getting it
- ready to be an apartment for rent. And I asked for the \$2500 to put in the air. So for me
- it was a benefit because I'm going to pay a hundred and some a month with very low
- 24 interests. I am able to so this because they are offering it and I am able to get it because
- of my husband's work, and the good credit. That's the most important thing. I take care
- of the credit rating.
- 27 [LOANS] Q: Sra Paula, a question, talking about credits if you would like to make
- improvements on your home without property titles and with property titles—in order to
- get a loan is the title important or is it really the credit rating, the work?
- 30 [TITLE] A: The title.
- A: Yes the title. Like us now, pardon me, are stuck there. My husband wanted to put a
- 32 carwash on the lot. But without the title, how? So they already told us don't do
- anything. He already cleaned it, evened it out, he paid for a truck of soil to come.
- 34 [WAITING] But that's where he had to stop. [TITLE] That's where we are at because
- now we are without a title. We are waiting. We need, like you said, the title. Like the
- water, they did not want to install it.
- 37 [TITLE] Q: Because you don't have a title?
- A: Because we don't have a title.
- Q: Is that your case as well?
- 40 [WAITING] A: Well no, I just have the solar, it's there. But they "relocated" it. That was
- 41 the good thing. They took it out from where we were and they put it somewhere else. I
- 42 think it was in a flood zone or something like that. And now I am also waiting to see
- where they are going to move me from Durango and see where I land. They told me at
- the last minute that it would also be [Madison Bebeche???].
- Q: So you have your solar but nothing is built. You are going to relocate.

- 1 [CONFLICT] A: Yes, they already helped me with one, now I am waiting for another
- one, the one from Durango. But who knows when that will be done.
- A: Where is Durango? Where I am at they say that is the Colonia Durango?
- 4 A: But it turned out that I did not now I was in the canal. I don't know what day it was
- 5 that I went, and when they called it to the attention of what Blas Chapa had done, I
- 6 looked and I said, oh fuck, I am right in the middle of the canal.
 - A: ohhhhh.

- 8 [CONFLICT] A: And I was going to build. And I had a fight with a man who even
- 9 pulled his gun out on me. Because I told him that was my solar, that why was he going to
- build there if I was going to build. And the man got mad and then I got into [an argument]
- with Blas Chapa and he said don't mortify yourself, I'll give you a place somewhere else.
- A: Well since they were in power, right. That's why there were so many disasters.
- A: Well, yes but power is given to the people that one believes are intelligent and at the
- same time all they want is to take advantage of the position. That's how politics works.
- And one is down here below you better not yell up because they will spit on you. (laugh)
- So one remains with that one but Blas Chapa did many things he should not have done.
- 17 Quite a few.
- 18 [TITLE] A: He sold to one of my sons. He gave him \$4,000 and some (y feria).
- 19 Q: What is "feria"?
- A: money, change, 5 or 10 cents.
- A: And the other one already had the property titles. And he got left out in the cold.
- I have the receipt for the \$4000 dollars.
- 23 [TITLE] [CONFLICT] A: I bought my house in cash (al Contado), I went for the title
- 24 which never appeared. The excuse he gave me was that I was illegal. (inaudible word)
- and then I said to him how can you give me that excuse that I am illegal when you did not
- ask me when you sold the land.
- A: Exactly.
- A: Now I bought from him, like many of us did out of need, right, I put it in my
- daughter's name. Since I don't have papers, I told him to put it in my daughter's name
- 30 So after well I got them. But I bought two solares one right after the other. I paid for one
- in cash and the other in (Tachi?) which I am paying monthly. But when everything came
- out in the open I came out very badly because (inaudible) I was not here but I was in the
- corner. And then my neighbor was given the title to one my solares and one of hers.
- And her other solar was left hanging dry. That is (inaudible) ... in the end I ended up
- 35 here and over there.
- 36 A: Ohh
- 37 [TITLE] A: So imagine there are 4 here, this is mine, this is my neighbor, neighbor. So
- my neighbor got this other one and I was left here and over there.
- A: So Blas, well he sold the titles and that's it. Now with this program what is it that we
- want them to resolve for us. Well I don't want move. Then we'll at least give you credit, to finish up.
- 42 Q: Sra. so you have these two solares? What about a little bridge?
- 43 [CONFLICT] A: I wanted the other lot because my house uses up almost all the solar. So
- I wanted the solar next to it so I could expand it, for parking, for the girls to play. But I
- simply have no space. I don't have any. My other solar is farther down.

- 1 [IMPROVEMENTS] A: And the neighbor would not want to give you the next lot
- 2 because she had built on it...
- 3 A: She had built on it and had fixed it up. And up to now I have not asked her anything.
- 4 A: She wanted her place (inaudible) and they said to me do you want this one, well I
- want that one. If it's getting nothing or getting that one, well give me that one. But 5
- 6 maybe they can still resolve it in parts.
- 7 Q: Maybe resolve it with the neighbor... 8
 - A: Well you know I have not yet tried.
- 9 [CONFLICT] A: And do you get along well with the neighbor, like enough, to say I will
- 10 give you this and I will give you this....
- [WAITING] A: look my neighbor does not want me to tell her I'm waiting. She wants to 11
- hide in her lot. So I have not talked to her and now it's not in my interests anymore to 12
- move my solar over here. 13
- 14 A: Because the other one is valued ...the one on the corner?
- A: No, because my daughter is married. And she does not want that solar, so if I don't 15
- give it to that [daughter], it's the same (laugh). 16
- A: Now it's in my interest to wait. I have two other girls. Instead of living on the corner 17
- 18 inaudible
- 19 A: It has happened twice, they were together. Because I have two brothers who live side
- 20 by side in Baladeces (?) and my sister bought here and my brother bought here. And it's
- tough for me because I go see one, and the other says you only go see the other. And I 21
- go with the other one, and she says you go with him. So I see sometimes, and it's hard 22
- 23 that they won't talk to each other.
- 24 A: It's very hard.
- A: It's very hard. And it's good that they gave your separated lots. We are only here on a 25
- 26 visit. That's why we are here. Suddenly we are talking and the next day we are dead. We
- 27 won't wake up. So the siblings are going to say, I had her so close on the corner and I
- 28 did not forgive her, and she's going to say, I had him on the corner and I did not forgive
- 29 him. And it happens, just 8 months ago my brother was killed. It was easy for him to
- take hold of the light, the wire up on my grandfathers little farm. And according to him 30
- he was going to put a light bulb and he had a breaker and everything was ready but he 31
- received all of the discharge of electricity inside him. He was 36 years old. So he and 32
- 33 his wife had fought, they lived in that colonia where I said that my other brother with the
- 34 house lives, they lived in a solar and the next one was my other brother, the married one.
- 35 So he beat her. She went to the hospital. So from there on they told him they didn't want
- 36 him around, that he should go back to Mexico. So he left, and that's when this happened.
- From April to October, they did not make up. She went to see him dead. 37
- A: What did she go for? 38
- 39 A: Well yes, but...
- A: Does he have kids? 40
- 41 A: Yes he has two, and so she would say that she was very hurt that Jose had beat her.
- 42 And I said, well tell me everything you want, but don't say anything to my mother.
- 43 Because you don't know the pain of a mother losing a child, understand that. The other
- thing is that those two brothers had been in jail. They had problems together, they got 44

- out together. But now one is dead, the other is back in jail and he says, Jose is here with
- 2 me mom.
- 3 A: Ohh
- 4 A: And if I should die, he says, I want you to cremate me and bury me with him.
- 5 Because there is only room my father is below there, and then my brother, and there is
- only spot left above. So it's extremely hard to be together.
- A: Yes, my eldest daughter I have [living] with me and my grandchildren. But you know
- 8 why I don't want her close to me, because my grandchildren are very machista. (laugh)
- 9 A: Yes but one loves the grandchildren so much.
- 10 A: Ah yes
- A: Yes, but I say, if it did not work out for me to have that lot, well it's okay that it is over
- there. Because whatever is mine, belongs to my daughters. A (inaudible) arrived at the
- house, and we are not going to do anything else to the house except the floor. The rest
- will remain as it is because there are other things to pay for. But at least for whatever is
- needed, it's [the lot] there. It's not for me nor the one who has more power. No, for the
- daughter that needs it, there it is.
- 17 [INSURANCE] Q: Passing onto to legal issues, before I forget a last thing about
- financial or economic issues the solares, the houses, the land, are they insured?
- 19 A: Yes, I have mine insured.
- 20 A: No.
- Q: Is it obligatory?
- A: No, it's not obligatory but it's necessary.
- A: No I don't have that.
- Q: For example, if you ask for a loan...
- A: ...they require it. And I had a very difficult experience. The times were very difficult,
- raining, the air blowing, and the neighbor in back I don't know if it was an accident or
- 27 what but her house burnt down. And my husband had to go onto our house to hose it
- down, and the fire almost got him and the house. So a brother in Houston said, you have
- 29 to insure that house because you don't know about the neighbors around you. You are
- mindful of the kids, watching that you don't leave candles on, but you don't know about
- 31 those around you. You are going to lose it and it's the one that is making your money
- work for you. You need to insure it for your own well-being. Now we go to Minnesota,
- to Nebraska, to Wisconsin. We go to work for 4 to 6 months, you don't know what
- intentions there are around you. Better pay a fee, I have mine insured with Owensteins(?),
- which is a very good insurance [company].
- O: Does anyone else have insurance?
- A: No I don't have it insured. But I went to get information on that, and was told that the
- area where I am at cannot be insured because there is no (inaudible with other voice
- 39 over)..
- A: What insurance company did you go see?
- 41 A: ah, let me see...
- 42 A: Look, it's not that I want this way but Castañeda, Sanco, those are just to stop the
- police, but they don't solve much. I have experiences with other insurance companies.
- In Owenstein or Farmers -- those are a bit better. [TITLE] And you take the title (policy?)
- with you, look I carry it with me. I carry it with me, because you take the title, they make

- 1 a copy and the insurance starts moving from that point on against thefts, against fire, if
- 2 someone has an accident on your land, or a piece of furniture is stolen that is insured.
- 3 And it's such a small fee I think, for it to resolve so many problems. My house is much
- 4 too big and I pay \$75 a month. And it is big. But you can even pay 40 something or 53.
- 5 Something that is going to cover you for \$40-50,000 dollars, it's much better.
- 6 [TITLE] Q: If I did not have the title, then I could not get insured?
- 7 A: No.
- 8 Q: In order to insure my house I need to have the title, is that right?
- 9 A: Yes, it's needed for that.
- A: Look, the title is necessary for everything. For example I was already on my land,
- building my house. But I knew that I could not negotiate with it, I could do nothing with
- it. My house was worthless because there was no title. [SELL] If for example I wanted to
- sell my house to her, look I'll sell you my house but I don't have a title, well I might as
- 14 well not have anything.
- 15 A: Exactly.
- 16 [SELL] Q: Have you personally, or your neighbors, observed that now that people the
- majority have their titles, are they wanting to sell them or not?
- 18 A: Well I would say they are more to live off of while with sacrifices you put up your
- 19 house, and then why would you want to sell.
- 20 A: Oh, no, I would want to sell. (laugh) Because years go by and the same happens to
- 21 houses as to cars, they start losing value. My house was made in 90. Now it's 11 years
- old, it's not worth the same because new colonias are opening up, more modern things.
- 23 So why stay with the old if you can break in the new. (laugh)
- 24 A: I don't think that way. For example, we started my house 4 or 5 years ago. After a
- while we made the floor, then we made the walls, and so for me my house is worth a lot.
- 26 I could not sell it.
- 27 A: For you it has a moral, material worth. That's your way of thinking. But in my way of
- 28 thinking, it is not new, let me move and perhaps improve or rise in value.
- A: Yes but in that situation of business...
- 30 A: No, look I have my sister here...
- 31 A: In a matter of business, it's another matter. It may be that I am a conformist, or, I am
- interested in painting a door or a wall or do something to the house. That's what I am
- *interested in.*
- 34 *A: She falls in love with a block.*
- 35 (inaudible)
- A: (laugh) talk, talk. Defend yourself.
- A: She does not go out because her house is not clean.
- A: No, if God allows, because He is the only one -- my son bought another lot, there in
- 39 the same colonia. La colonia Chaparritos, it's by La Ladrillera, and he bought a lot for
- 40 the amount of \$8900 dollars. Well that's the value. And he's going to be paying \$140 a
- 41 month. And he wants to begin another house there. But I want the house smaller. I
- don't want it high, or ... well we start getting older and there is more work to be done.
- Q: I was wondering, are more people doing it like a business or ...
- 44 [TITLE] [SELL] A: Oh yes, like me now.
- 45 Q: ... now I have the title, I can sell it...

- 1 A: Yes like me in this case. I have only 2 kids. So as others were saying, if one of them
- 2 gets married, since the house has two stories, well then there is room for the boy. Or if
- not, I will rent it out. You understand, and that's a benefit.
- 4 A: And since I am more materialistic...
- 5 A: I tell my son, he's 18 and I it has been 3 years since he's working. I tell him, right
- 6 now I am making value at 6%. I am financing you something that is worth \$30,000
- dollars. But I am going to give to you at 30,000. But if you know how to benefit from it,
- 8 if you know how to live well, don't be getting drunk, into drugs, in bars -- you will have a
- 9 house. If not you are going to pay me \$300 dollars monthly so that I can make believe I
- have a renter. Because my love, I cannot give you everything -- To teach him to be
- responsible. Because it's very bad to give them everything without it costing them
- anything. No. If I am doing what I am doing it is so that he struggles to be a little better,
- so he can make it to university, or a place where he can improve. No, my son, I am going
- to give it all to you then what is going to become of your children?
- O: Do some people, for example, use the property title to ask for loans for a business or
- for education, using the land, the solar as collateral?
- 17 A: No.
- A: Well, on my part, no. I don't either because I am alone, I am old. What good would it
- do me to ask for it and if I could not pay for it later.
- 20 O: Not sell it, but use it as collateral?
- 21 A: No.
- Q: Like you were talking of setting up your carwash.
- A: Well yes, but the problem is that lot has not been resolved.
- Q: But once you do...
- A: Oh, yes, of course. Because that was the thinking behind it -- That my son wanted to
- set up a carwash there and behind it make a little house. Do you understand me?
- O: Of Course.
- A: But right now the process if going slowly, it has been almost 6 or 7 months.
- Q: Does anyone else know anyone who is doing this?
- 30 A: Well, no.
- A: I do. I'm in a tight spot but my daughter is married and if I can I want to do
- 32 something like that.
- A: Of course, it benefits one.
- 34 A: In benefit of her education...
- 35 A: Yes her education.
- A: I'm not going to go into debt to make a house for her, but if she wants to continue to
- study, and there is no money and this is the solution to her problem, yes.
- 38 [TITLE] [SELL] Q: And you can do that because you have a title?
- A: Because I have the title. Because before without the title, I could not do anything. I
- 40 could not sell it, I could not do anything.
- Q: Any other use you can think of or you are making or you have seen your neighbors
- making of the property title now that they have it in terms of loans or businesses?
- Because many people say that now the property title can be used to get loans, for
- 44 mortgages, for setting up a small business, a micro-enterprise. Are there any other
- 45 examples or cases here?

- 1 A: Well, no. Not at least that I know.
- 2 Q: And the last question about this. The interest rates that you were charged before for
- 3 using your house to get a loan, usually, when those asking for the loan are of lower
- 4 economic resources the interest rates are extremely high. They [lenders] are usurers.
- 5 A: They would not take them. If the interests are too high, we didn't accept the loans.
- 6 Q: Have they gone down because of the title or the economy?
- 7 A: Because of the economy.
- 8 A: Economy.
- 9 A: It's because of the economy. Since September 11th the interests rates went down. Do
- you understand. So that there will be more....
- 11 Q: (inaudible)... are really low.
- 12 A: Well, that's the way it is.
- 13 [TITLE] Q: Any other comment, opinion that you have. What did it mean, or does it mean or can it mean to have the property title?
- A: It means a lot because it helps us, since we are of lower income, we don't have
- education. We are just ...at the footsteps. So they give us Medicaid –because I am going
- to ask, just like I came here to ask for help because I needed it. So if they give us these
- opportunities, this gives us a base upon which to work on, from where to grab onto. I
- don't have to go asking for food stamps anymore. Before they use to give me \$400
- dollars. Now with the way the situation is, now I get \$100 dollars. So I am improving my
- economic status. I am improving! Why? Because they are giving me less because I have
- something to work with now. If I did not have, there I would be food stamps, food stamps.
- Q: Do you have work or do you have your house?
- A: No I say it because of my house. With the help, I had enough to buy a truck for my son who moved to school.
- 20 Soft who moved to school.
- Q: All this from the mortgage on your house?
- [LOANS] A: Exactly. It's a mortgage. So now I have something to grab onto. If I did not have the property title, I would not build the outside stairs.
 - [End of side one]

31

[IMPROVEMENTS] Q: So the house provides you with more opportunities?

- A: And since we have the hope of improving it as the lady was saying, I paint it, I fix it up because I don't let it decay. But if you let it rot, to fall down, then the bank is not
- up because I don't let it decay. But if you let it rot, to fall down, then the bank is not going to give you anything. [TITLE] Yes, the property title has helped quite a bit.
- Q: Now, lets look at issues that are more legal in nature. If you would like to have a soda...
- 38 A: No, no just continue.
- 39 Q: Well, in terms of legal issues, our friend Jane is a lawyer. One of the questions she
- has, besides being owner/property holder, what are other ways of (inaudible) when you
- 41 have the property title?
- A: Well to get out of where I am over there, and come over here. (laughter) [LOANS]
- Because I bought near the river, and it's a flood zone there where I am living and it's in
- my benefit to live over here where it's not a flood zone and over here I have more

- opportunities for loans. Over there they tell you right away no -- it's a flood zone, I
- 2 can't loan you money and you are stuck there.
- 3 [INSURANCE] A: And they won't insure it either.
- 4 A: Not that either.
- 5 [TITLE] A: It's as if you didn't have the title. It's of no worth since you can't insure it
- 6 because it floods. If the river leaves its banks.... laughter.
- 7 [TITLE] A: No, but there have been floods. And now that they have given us the title,
- 8 [IMPROVEMENTS] we can BUILD (voice intonation) here. It's not like we are stuck
- 9 over there where you cannot even invest in the home, invest nothing because you'll lose
- everything when the river overflows. And that's not the case over here.
- 11 (lots of background talking other group of people in the room?)
- Q: If you want to define the person that is the owner of the solar, what do call her/him?
- 13 A: Property holder (propietario).
- 14 Q: What do you call her/him?
- 15 A: Property holder or owner (dueno). It means the same thing.
- 16 A: Someone who has the title deed (escrituras).
- 17 [TITLE] A: I wanted to ask a question.
- 18 Q: Yes go ahead.
- A: Are they going to send my title deeds or not?
- Q: Ay... of course.
- A: Yes they will send them. You have to think positively.
- Q: How long ago did you begin the process, Sra?
- A: Like 10 years ago.
- A: I have been here 13 years and I already have my title.
- Q: Did you already come here and sign papers?
- A: Already.
- A: We have not signed papers for this other lot.
- Q: So you already have the title, what you don't have is the pretty thing (paper?).
- 29 (laughter)
- A: I tell my husband he was educated in Mexico and he worked 9 years with the
- 31 Ministry of Natural Resources, which is of the government. So he tells me- and I don't
- have an education. So he said Ay Araceli if you had reached at least 12th grade, you'd
- be ordering me around like this (snapping of fingers).
- Q: I'm going to tell you something. I understand you completely because I am a woman
- too. Many times we as women and as parents, say that we don't know more, that we
- don't have education. Araceli you have a great education...
- 37 A: oh yes.
- 38 Q: But of course...
- A: But I need to defend myself a little more.
- Q: You may not have the papers but really, do not feel diminished by that at all. Because
- 41 many people who do have education, do not (inaudible).
- 42 A: Yes it's true.
- Q: It could be because of adversity, because of this or that, but you do not have to have
- any shame to say that you do not have an education. Don't even say it.

- 1 A: No I do not feel ashamed. But like in the bank I know several people like the
- 2 secretary who has been there since a long time ago because my father signed for \$500
- dollars credit and I already have been there for 20 years. And I have lent money. I
- 4 won't fail, because I lent \$5000 dollars to finance a taxi in Monterrey and they paid
- 5 \$7000. And a cousin of mine, because my husband even with lawyers and notary
- 6 public and everything -- will do the job half-assed. No but they are people we know,
- 7 never is there any distrust between us I love her so much. (laugh) No, so there is no
- 8 talk later. Until it was his turn to lose. And I tell my son, you are the one who has to
- 9 improve, move forward, do everything right because it's very dangerous.
- A: Like the court of the town (corte) where there is proof (constancia); words are taken
- by the wind. And that's what happened to us...
- A: That did not happened to us with Sr. Elias, but rather (inaudible) but we had papers, I
- have work and everything...
- Q: That's interesting, I wanted to ask a question now that we are looking at that the
- majority of the cases here, has it been the women who have done the paperwork, or your
- husbands, or are you alone (single)?
- 17 A: My husband was the one who did the paperwork for the lots.
- 18 A: Araceli did it herself (laugh).
- 19 A: Both because I never have taken the right away from my husband. I have never
- taken it away. It's just that we do it in agreement.
- A: Yes the two of you.
- Q: Is that your case also Sra. Sunso (?), Maria de Jesus?
- A: It's wrong to say so, but I have always been (inaudible). Whatever I say, and what you
- decide...
- A: He gives you the right...
- A: I can't build her, but I support you. (inaudible) but I am here, here's the check, I will
- sign it and you go change it as best you can.
- A: My husband too. The same.
- A: We are in agreement. Because I have a great fortune. I have a man who is very
- civilized, and he trusts in me and know that what I am going to do -- if I joined him it
- was because of love, my children came to the world because of love. So never, "mija"
- am I going to think badly of you. You are doing I am going to give you the trust and
- the right. It's not that I am in charge but that he gives me the authorization.
- Q: But are all of you here married, or living with your ...
- A: I am a widow.
- 36 O: Widow...
- A: I became a widow at 40.
- 38 Q: Married, all are married (laughter)
- 39 A: At 40 I became a widow and that's when we were fixing things up and he died, and I
- 40 tried to come over to this side. Because around a month after he died the situation fell...
- 41 Q: Fell?
- 42 A: Yes, and then Blas came and I told him what was happening, and he said well
- 43 whatever way you cross (the river?), and I had 10 children.
- 44 Q: You had ten children?

- 1 A: I had ten children (laughter)... Inaudible .. imagine what would of happened if he had
- 2 come over.
- 3 Q: My mom also had... I am the eighth of eleven children. We are 8 sisters and 3
- brothers and I am the 8th. My mom also had eleven.
- 5 A: I had 12 but two died, and now I have 10 kids.
- 6 A: But it's very nice.
- 7 Q: It is very nice.
- 8 A: And after I came with him (With Blas' help?), and I was alone, and then we made it
- 9 through.
- 10 Q: You are single?
- 11 A: Yes.
- Q: And you did your paperwork? You are single and have pushed forward.
- [INHERITANCE] Q: The rest of you, when you say for example that in legal terms, that
- 14 you are on the property title, for example with Elias, does the title have his name, or
- always in the name of both...
- 16 A: Both...
- 17 Q: Or do you have demand it?
- A: No, it's not demanded. But I remember when I came for the first title, my husband was
- in Mexico. They were going to give it to me, and I needed it so I put it only in my name.
- And the next title was when my husband was out of town, and it's in his name. But I am
- aware that it is not mine, it's both of ours.
- Q: Are all the cases the same the titles are in the couples' name?
- A: No, it's only in my husband's name.
- Q: Just in his name?
- A: Yes, but like she says, we are in agreement about everything.
- Q: But do you know, are you aware, do you have an idea if legally if it's only in the
- 27 name of the wife, or only in the name of the husband, if it belongs to both of you or not?
- 28 A: Yes.
- 29 [TITLE] A: I know because when --- look the title is in my name but years ago I don't
- know what happened but I wanted to make a will. It's my property, it's for ... no, my
- 31 house it belongs to husband for as long as he lives, he cannot sell the house, he has to live
- 32 there. For example the land is mine. From me it passes to my husband and then to my
- daughters. My daughters are going to live there while they are small.
- [INHERITANCE] Q: Your daughters are with your husband?
- A: Yes, they are his daughters. But the only thing that I tell my daughters, and I could not
- do it in the will because he would not cede to me his part. So there I buy... even if it's in
- my name, half belongs to him. But he was supposed to make a will for me where he
- ceded the rights of the house to me. And he gave me the right to do with the house. And
- I did not do it because he would not sign the paper. He did not sign the paper because I
- was on this side [of the border?]. So the last daughter who will look after their father,
- 41 that is the one that will get the house. And that's what I have told him. And that's what I
- 42 put in the will. That he could not sell. That he would become old and die and the one
- 43 who took care of him would keep the house. But I did not do the will because he would
- not sign... Even though it was in my name.

- Q: In reality, even though it may be only under one name, it is a patrimonial good, it
- belongs to both. So even if it's only in your husband's name, you have the right...
- A: have the same right as the husband...
- 4 A: And if we are only together, not married?
- 5 Q: Not married...
- 6 A: Well the children, who have his last name...
- Q: When the lawyer arrives, we'll ask her. I'm and economist but she's a lawyer.
- 8 (laughter)
- 9 A: Economy is the class that Diana has now, economics.
- Q: Oh yes? So she is the one that knows the legal questions. I think so, we have to ask
- her. And that's why I was asking you this, because it's very important sometimes we
- women don't know. Because usually it's in the husband's name but it's a communal
- good. (in English question.)
- A: [women translating what Jane said] No, if your not married, you have to put it on
- 15 [name on title]. Sometimes the law recognizes a nonmarital union in Texas, but to be
- safe, a woman not a wife should have her name on the title.
- 17 Q: Even if you bought together?
- Jane: If you bought together, you both put money in, yes.
- 19 A: But if the name of the husband is not there?
- Jane: If you are living together by only one person's money, he's buying it the person
- earning wages, it can be said to belong to that person. You can go to court and claim that
- you have what is called an "informal marriage," but it is not automatic.
- A: Then it does not belong to me? It belongs to him?
- Jane: You are much less protected if you are not married. Is it in your name as well?
- 25 A: Yeah.
- Jane: If it's in your name, that's fine. But if it's not in your name, and it's only in his
- 27 name and you are not married, you are much more vulnerable.
- Q: Because what we were saying before is that even though it's only in one persons name,
- just because you are married, it belongs to both. Not like in the case of Sra. Cruz. Sra.
- Cruz put it in her name only. However, in order to inherit it, she cannot do it because
- 31 automatically only because you are married even though it is in your name, it belongs
- 32 to both.
- A: And if I die, who becomes responsible? The kids, or can he do something. Who will
- be able to do something if I am not even married to him? Or nobody is going to get
- anything?
- Jane: The important thing is that your name is on the title.
- Q: If her name is on the title, it means her children can inherit that ...
- Jane: Yes, your part of it.
- Q: In reality, I guess the message is, if you are not married, you should have the title in
- 40 your name to have a right to your part of the property. If you are married, whether your
- name is there or not, it does not matter. Either way you have a right to 50%. But if you
- are not married, it is important that your name be on the title because it's your only
- 43 guarantee.
- A: So if I get married, I have to make a will?

- Jane: You have half of it, if your name is on it with a partner. And if you write a will or
- 2 not, when you die, half of it will go on to your children. If you are the wife who survives,
- 3 Texas law says that you get the whole of the homestead. But only half of everything else
- 4 car, money, business, etc.
- 5 A: Half, not everything?
- 6 Jane: Half.
- A: The other half is going to be for him?
- 8 Jane: Yes. And all of the house.
- 9 [Must have made a motion of disgust]
- 10 A: What do you mean no?
- 11 A: No, for then another woman to come and he set her up in my house.
- 12 A: Oh yes.
- 13 A: That happens.
- Q: But even if you are married and he dies, the house is yours and only 50% of
- everything else. It's the same thing. When you buy a good any good- a house, as the
- lady was saying, she wanted to leave the inheritance for her daughters, but if he will not
- sign, and does not approve, she cannot leave more than 50%. You are owner of 50%
- only.
- A: When you are going to get married and you have a fortune, you have to get married
- with separate property (legal term in English for Bienes Separados?) so that way from
- 21 the beginning what is yours is yours and will continue to be yours. When you get
- 22 married by (bienes separados).
- A: And what was earned during the marriage?
- Jane (?): What was earned during the marriage automatically belongs to you both in half
- shares until you are divorced.
- A: For example, look at Lucero, who is an artist. She is married with (Bienes Separados)
- so what she makes is hers even though she is married.
- Q: So even when she earns money during the time they are married, does that only
- belong to her?
- Jane: If they are both earning money, it does not matter when you are married. It belongs
- automatically to both of you.
- O: That's what she said.
- A: But suppose you have bought things in both names, there it counts.
- 34 (background discussion about picking someone up, and getting numbers)
- Q: Don't go yet we are still in the middle ofa heated discussion (laughter)
- Q: In reality it is something very important. Like when Araceli was saying that she did
- not have education, I understand. I am also a woman of poor parents (?), so many times
- we tend to say, well let him do it, let him do it...
- A: Oh, no not me.
- Q: And in reality it has a lot to do with it, because legally ...
- 41 A: If something happens you have to communicate.
- A: No, when I say that I lack education, I mean like showing up at a hospital, at a bank. I
- 43 need a diploma to better understand.
- Q: But that's why there is the GED right?
- 45 A: The GED, I have not taken it.

- 1 Q: And there are classes in many of these community centers that are really helpful.
- 2 A: Oh, yes, they help quite a bit.
- 3 [TITLE] Q: Going back to the title (laughter) do you believe the relationships between
- 4 people in the colonias have improved, grown, (inaudible) now that people have the title?
- A: Well it's improved I think. I say from other people I know. I don't know if they are
- 6 going to come. They have already finished their house, they put in central air through a
- 7 local program, right. And they have the title which they got here.
- 8 Q: Do you think it has improved?
- 9 A: Oh yes. Of course.
- 10 Q: Here in the community?
- A: Oh yes, and like I told you, I don't have my title yet. We still need the title to begin
- something on the lot.
- 13 [TITLE] A: For example the property title is like a marriage certificate, if you are not
- married with that person well it does not exist, even though you are living together,
- keeping the union together you are nobody. You have no rights over that person. If you
- are married, you have more rights in all aspects. The same with property. We have
- rights in everything. Simply now that (inaudible) either you are the wife or you live
- together. I am the husband. I am his owner. My property. My marriage is my property
- of him. I have all the rights with him. It's the same with the house. The title is my right
- to it. It's yours.
- A: yes. That's what happens with cars too. I once had a problem with a car...
- A: It's just that we have to compare it to other things because that's the reality of the
- world.
- A: Oh yes, face reality. I bought a car for a nephew, and the car was cheap at \$600
- dollars, right Rosa? And then the men did not want to give me the title. They just did not.
- So I came with Lito Garza, the policeman, and I said, look I have a car, and it's really
- stolen because they don't want to give me the title. But I am not guilty. And he said,
- well can you involve these people so that they can testify to that on paper ... oh, I said, I
- can do that easily. And I went and knocked on the lady's door. And I said, look I said, I
- have few resources, and I reported to the stamp (food stamp office?) that I had taken
- \$1000 dollars out of the bank. I want you to give me a letter testifying that I have given
- you \$600 for that car for which you have not given me the title. And she said, just to take
- it to the food stamps? I have to take it. Oh, ok. She did right there. Maria so and so sold
- a car to Araceli Guajardo for \$600. She has paid me but I have not given her the title yet.
- Yes that's enough. I took it and went to the police.
- Q: What if she had not given you that paper, even if it was a lie?
- A: Exactly, but I had to lie to get a benefit for myself because I was saying the truth but
- nobody believed me since I had only had a nephew as a witness. So how do I do so
- that ... I was asking for something just. I never told her I was going to go to the police
- but ...give it to me because I need it. One has to face, as you were saying, the facts of life.
- And I knew, oh shit, I lost. But Lito Garza just said to me, try to get a paper witnessing
- and that's it or you will have her as your enemy. No well I don't want her as an enemy.
- A: So for example in terms of couples, to have the property title in common, does it help?
- 44 A: Yes.
- 45 Q: Or is it another additional problem?

- 1 A: No, no it's not a problem.
- 2 [TITLE] Q: Because before you did not have a title, and now you do. Does that change
- your relations with your neighbors, your partner?
- 4 A: No the neighbors are the same, they are very good neighbors. And I try to be a good
- 5 neighbor. Because behind me I had some neighbors that were of the religion... and they
- 6 did not like me because I am Catholic. But simply, it's about peoples mentality. We are
- 7 the same people.
- 8 Q: And the majority of the people where you live now, do they already have their titles?
- 9 Or does the majority not have them yet?
- 10 A: Some...
- 11 A: The majority have it. My brother
- 12 A: I would say yes...
- A: What I wanted to ask is this when they were putting the titles in the names of those
- people, right, which was the problem that my dad had. I have a brother here, and I live
- here and the solar in the middle belongs to my dad. So my dad says, what are we going
- to do with the solar, I am going to cede half to each through a lawyer. And so 50 feet for
- my brother and 50 feet for me, right, which makes 100 feet. [TAXES] So he left it
- written here with a lawyer, and as time passed on what happened around a year, or two
- 19 years later right, my brother does not want to be responsible for the taxes and does not
- want any problems. So my dad is thinking of selling it. But I don't want other people to
- go in there since we use it for parking, my brother as well as me. I never expect to put up
- a fence or anything. Leave it so that he can use it and I use it. But he does not want to be
- responsible for anything, just park his car there. But I paid \$4000 dollars to my dad, and
- I went to the notary public with him to sign...
- Q: You paid for 50 feet?
- A: Yes, No. But my brother does not know anything. He doesn't even care to know
- about those 50 feet because he does not want to pay. [TAXES] But at the moment that I
- bought the solar from my father for \$4000 dollars, does my brother lose the right, or does
- 29 he still have it?
- A: He's not paying the taxes?
- Jane: Did the father write anything?
- O: Is it written?
- A: It's written here in the Colonias Unidas.
- Q: That he gave you half the solar?
- 35 A: Yes.
- Q: And you have bought half of your father's solar?
- A: No, well supposedly I bought it all because at that moment he did not inherit me
- anything. I bought from him.
- Q: So do you have a paper, just like with Lito Garza, you have a paper, right?
- 40 A: I have a notarized paper signed by my father.
- 41 Jane: Notarized from the father...
- 42 A: Not from my brother.
- 43 Q: So your brother is not aware of it?

- 1 A: He did not become involved. He did not even want to, nor does he want to pay, nor
- does he want to know. (Several people talking in background, including Jane and
- interviewer)... it's like my father gave it to us, and then he took it away, and he sold it.
- 4 Q: And in whose name is the title?
- 5 A: My name.
- 6 [WAITING] Q: So it's in your name now.
- A: [TAXES] [TITLE] That's the one we are waiting to fix the taxes because that title was
- 8 "confused". But since he made that paper with a lawyer, that's more powerful than a
- 9 notary public. So, if he wants to fight me on it, a lawyer is going to win since a lawyer
- has a lot more power than a notary public that certifies a document.
- 11 [TITLE] A: Have you presented this title to the courts? And that's the important thing,
- that you have presented it to the courts, not that a notary public did it. That's what I think
- Q: But this is a case where a legal problem may ensue; that her brother says no I also
- have a right. In terms of that benefit, it's not only your brother, but if there are several
- siblings, you cannot say to the other brothers and sisters....
- 16 A: Poor you if Rosario knows... (laughter)
- [INHERITANCE] A: When the siblings are more united, there are more problems with
- the inheritance.
- A: Well at least we think this way, I have my dad for two years now, I thought "whoever
- can fit in ii, try it on, whoever has time, attend to it". He give us life, youth, love, and if
- you want to return it, good. But I am not willing to let it go to a war. He gave me much
- love which I can return now that he needs it. So I don't think there will be a fight
- among them because they witnessed that I gave those \$4000.
- Q: So that's not an inheritance as long as your dad is alive. For example, if your father
- has a truck and wants to sell it, he does not have to discuss it with everyone. It's his plan.
- So I think.... Now there is one other thing. When one has the title, perfect, you have a
- guarantee. That's very positive. But it also implies responsibility in terms of the property
- 28 title...
- [TAXES] A: Pay the taxes...
- A: Because when you did not have the title you didn't have to pay the taxes. SO if they
- don't give you anything, you're going to lose that money.
- A: I pay the taxes gladly, and every time I go pay them I say yikes its \$500 or \$700 what
- I have to pay, but with the hope that they pave the street. (Laughter)
- [IMPROVEMENTS] A: I don't want them to pave the streets in the colonia.
- A: Why my love?
- A: Because if they race without pavement, imagine what will happen once it is paved.
- A: No, no everyone is responsible for their steering wheel and the accidents that happen.
- Because those that are going to suffer are those racing cars.
- A: Yeah but those who are racing are having fun. But if my daughter is out on the streets,
- I am the one who suffers, my daughters is the one who has to come inside.
- 41 A: Yes a lot of drunks play on this street.
- 42 A: Where I live, every night (inaudible)
- Q: They play with what, with cars? Who races?
- A: The young kids from the colonia. It's just that racing in such a populated area...

- A: But I do want them to pave here, the value goes up, it goes up in category. It's like when you a dance downtown, you dress up more elegantly.
- 3 Q: A few more questions, I know we are all getting tired. Lets say that the person who
- 4 received the property title... well there are different situations. Lets think of different
- 5 legal situations like the ones we are discussing. The person who has a written contract,
- 6 even if it has errors, do they have a right to their title?
- 7 [TITLE] Q: A person that has the deed the title but it has errors, who does it belong to?
- 8 Do they have a right to the property title, or not? An error, because like two people have
- 9 the same title. Who has the right?
- A: I think that the way the situation is right now, everyone has their own title. But what
- happens for example is that when at the beginning, when all this began, there were errors,
- when nothing was legal, when two people had the same lot, two people had the same title,
- now that is not happening anymore. All this is coming out into the open. And now for
- example, the people who still do not have title, I think, i'ts because that lot probably had
- two owners. That's why they don't have the title yet. Or there were more serious
- problems than those that I experienced. Because my problem was simple. It was my
- land, my title, and it was my (inaudible coughing by tape recorder), I was the owner, so
- it was simple to do. If there are two people, one is closer and the other farther away, then
- there is a problem.
- Q: If you, for example, have your solar, your land, and sibling of yours arrives with
- 21 his/her family ...(inaudible) to live there with his/her family in the same zone. You are
- there on a piece of land that is already yours. If you would like to sell this land, do you
- have to inform your sibling? Do you have to cede it to him/her?
- A: No. No because you are lending it or renting it out. I would do it in some way were
- 25 there was an agreement in order to not just do it like that because by law you have to give
- 3 months notice for them go find another place. But not that he says yes sell it to me or
- 27 not, because I am the owner.
- A: For example, the land that I have disoccupied right now, I have some neighbors that
- are trailer-truck drivers (traileros) and since they have a trailer, I have to use the space as
- a parking lot. And we are in agreement, that when I need it, they will disoccupy it. Not
- in the meantime since there is nothing there. But we have an agreement that if I need it, I
- can put my car there. But I do have to let him know... (inaudible) But I don't have to
- sell or I could if I wanted to. And if it were my brother, or my daughter, I would say you
- can live there and pay rent or so much
- Q: Do you ask the truck drivers for rent?
- A: No. Because the will (inaudible) the solar.
- A: That's fine, they are neighbors. As a favor.
- 38 O: Does that exist a lot?
- 39 A: Yes, here it does.
- A: [TAXES] But I have the title, he pays the taxes?
- 41 A: Not in Minnesota.
- 42 A: No because I doubt there are any unoccupied lots.
- 43 Q: Because they speak English?
- 44 A: No, I also know English.

- 1 A: No because, for example my neighbors are truckers. They don't have a big piece of
- 2 land because there is only one solar. And I have another solar so they can use it.
- 3 A: Because we Hispanics have more communication than even the Americans. They are
- a bit more distanced. You with your problem, and I with mine. That's what they are like.
- 5 So one has more communication you fight more, but you help each other out more too.
- And I have been over there (MN?)—and I treat them well the blacks (morenos) as well
- as the Americans. But I see a difference with all of them. Exactly, that's the way it is.
- 8 [INHERITANCE] Q: Lets say there is a hypothetical situation, an imaginary one, where
- 9 one of our husbands was married previously and when he writes up his will, he leaves our
- property in the name of his other children...
- 11 A: And what about mine?
- Q: Does he have a right?
- A: He has a right to leave an inheritance to the other children, but he has more right to
- inherit to mine.
- A: Thanks to God, that problem does not exist here. At least, among those of us that are
- 16 here.
- 17 A: Well mine had problem... He has four... Ay that is what is hard.
- Q: Does he have a right or not, do you think?
- A: No. Because it has been based on my work. Since he has been with me, it's for my
- 20 kids.
- A: But that's why just like she was saying, that's why you should get married. Or you
- should do something, fix the papers for your kids, because you never know.
- A: A case happened here in the U.S.
- 24 A: Yes...
- 25 [CONFLICT] A: This person had gotten married in Mexico, the man was married in
- Mexico. But then he came over to this side and it was easy for him to get married again.
- And he had his family, but he never got divorced. This person has an accident here on
- 28 this side [of the border], and when the second wife goes to claim her money, the wife has
- nothing to do there. The wife in Mexico was the beneficiary, not the one here.
- A: Because she was the second one and so was not legal.
- A: It's not legal because..(inaudible) as long as they don't get divorced.
- 32 A: Its polygamy.
- A: I fixed a problem of those for a neighbor, with me as a lawyer (laughter).
- A: Don't doubt it.
- A: A neighbor woman lived with her sister. Her husband left her 30 years ago, and he
- left her with 4 kids. And they made do. She came over here [to the U.S.] and she was
- 37 already 76 years old. She could not ask for anything, not a social security number nor
- Medicaid nor anything. So I heard about her legal situation. She was still married with
- her husband and he had another family. And I said, go to social security and claim his
- social security because you have the right since you never divorced.
- Q: And that's a very important thing, in legal terms, now that only women are here and
- that's why we wanted a meeting without husbands, to say think it over, you have rights.
- You have rights and it's very important that you remember. We don't always know. But
- it's important to remember that if one is not married, your name must be present. If you

- are married.... We thank you profoundly, for all your opinions. No one is right or wrong.
- 2 Everyone has a right to their opinion...
- 3 A: to their way of thinking...
- 4 Q: So I am in agreement with Rosa, or not with Maria or whatever. We all have a right to
- 5 our opinion and that's why it is a great thing that we are here...
- 6 A: Support each other to defend ourselves and know how to do it.
- 7 Q: So we thank you.... Jane...walmart
- 8 A: I have two titles.... (Laughter)
- 9 Q: It was a pleasure to meet you all. And whenever you would like, I am at A&M
- 10 University...
- A: As long as my title is fixed ... and thank you for dedicating us this time and because
- we learn from you quite a bit.
- 13 (too much commotion to hear)
- 14 Q: How many children do you have?
- 15 A: Four.
- 16 Q: Four? So your husband (inaudible)...
- 17 A: You need to fix the situation.
- Q: But everything is in your name, right, so its okay.
- 19 Q: Gabina, how many kids do you have?
- A: Four also.
- A: And I have two.
- A: I have four.
- Q: Maria has 10. (laughter)
- 24 A: No 3.
- Q: No, but I am the 8^{th} .
- A: With so many brothers and sisters it must be fun.
- A: My siblings and I, support each other. If I'm going to have a celebration, they help
- me out. If someone is sick, we go over. Big families are for everyone. There are more
- 29 problems but more love, more affection... My mother died 2 years ago.
- A: Pardon me, my father-in-law's father is very sick. My husband's father- he's in the
- hospital. Today at 11 well they thought he had some clogged veins. He's 90 years old.
- 32 So my daughter went to work, and since today was only for women....
- A: Mine are two...
- A: No that's not legal.
- A: I have two titles... (I think they are joking that since they have two titles, they deserve
- two Wal-Mart certificates)
- A: So do I, so does she...
- 38 Q: You have two lots.
- 39 A: Yes, I have two lots.
- 40 Q: Together or separated?
- 41 A: Separated, because I bought out on the Westside. They are spatially together like
- 42 neighbors. But it's one title first and then the other. I don't have them together, they are
- 43 separated.
- 44 A: Because my brother did put both lots together.
- 45 A: And I have not done that –

- A: and if you have your house in between, at least just a little bit... A: No, it does not overflow into the other one at all.
